2. Coming up with an original idea

When you write, add your own blend of the concepts you are writing about. For instance, no one will have the same childhood or experience that is uniquely yours. Narrating your own experience will not only engage your readers but also show the authenticity of your idea.

Another way of developing an original idea is voicing your opinion about a particular subject or topic. However, don't get caught up in voicing the opinions of others, which is as good as plagiarizing.

3. The facets of plagiarism

Plagiarism is a nightmare for academics, professionals, editors, as well as those who deal with content. With the emergence of <u>artificial intelligence (AI) writing tools</u>, it is even more difficult to filter out plagiarized works from the original ones.

So, the first rule of thumb is, don't use these tools even if you have an original idea and struggle with writing. This is because you can take help from colleagues about the writing and present your idea but it is bad ethics to use AI tools to help you write. Besides, at this point in time, these tools are unreliable.

Another rule is, to learn all the rules of plagiarism—let's list a few basic ones here.

- When it's not your idea, you pass it on as your own.
- When you don't own the copyright.
- When you haven't taken permission from the owner, and use it without crediting.
- When you use a verbatim quote, content, or part of an article without credit or reference.
- When you use facts, and statistics researched by others without credits.
- And when opinions, thought leadership, and editorials belong to someone else.

The best way to avoid plagiarism is to find out what is considered plagiarism and understand how to avoid it when you are writing your essay.

4. Research is the standard





One of the most important aspects of essay writing, especially when you are writing an academic essay, it is important to do extensive research. It is given that a research essay should credit documents, research work, and essays by others. However, referencing may be the best way to avoid violations but it does not make up for an original essay write-up. So, how do you write an original research essay?

Taking your stance in the thesis statement. From there, work your way through your academic essay by giving evidence with researched references. But don't just list references and quotes from there. Add in your argument and prove that your opinion is based on the evidence you have provided. When you add in arguments and opinions you are giving unique views of an established study, fact, or idea.

5. Original creatives as ideas

Some writing platforms, publishers, universities, and journals allow writers to add imagery or artwork. This opens up a whole new avenue for adding originality to your writing. In journalistic essays, this means throwing in your own photos taken of the events. In creative essay writing, you can use artwork or photos (again) to enforce your concept and present it in an original manner. And in academics, illustrations, tabulated graphs, and charts from your own researched data help in making your essay original.

There is no limitation in today's digital world to add creatives to make your writing more authentic, personalized, and original. From presentations to interview podcasts, YouTube tutorials, and similar media are rich forms of creatives that you can use in your writing to make up for original ideas.
